

The Crown granted a patent to Luois Jewitt November 12, 1868 for Lot 14 Concession 2. By 1871 Wm. Jewitt owned the farm. He donated about 1 acre for a cemetery from Lot 14. This cemetery was called Browntown Cemetery but was aslo known as Jewitt Cemetery.

Ed Bosman who owned Lot 15, donated land for a church about the same time. This was Ebenezer Methodist Church, later the United Church. It was very active until 1949 when it was sold and torn down.

There had been several buryings in the cemetery prior to 1871. A small child was buried there in 1866. Then in 1867 Ann Howington aged 81 yrs. was laid to rest there. The following year Elizabeth Mustard Calder aged 86 yrs was buried.

Browntown area was not settled until 1854. In 1943 when the last burial took place the village was gone and only a scattering of farms remained.

The last burial was of Sandy McDoanld a bachelor. He went from farm to farm throughout the township chopping and sawing wood for a living. He would work a few days at most farms until the woodpile and woodbox were were well supplied. Then he would go on to the next farm. He died at age 52 years. He had no family and no stone has been erceted to his memory.

At Morris Centinnial time about 1956, the cemetery was cleaned up by the township. A cement slab supports the oldest stones. Those which were in good condition still stand around the back.




