1.0 CALL TO ORDER

7.0 STAFF REPORTS

7.1 CLERK

7.1.1 COVID-19 Update

A report was presented by CAO/Clerk Trevor Hallam in this regard for the information of Council.

Deputy Mayor Zinn asked if opening the Bluevale Hall is a decision of the board or the Municipality. Mr. Hallam explained that staff have made decisions to close the Hall when required by the regulations, but the decision to reopen the Hall is that of the Board should the regulations allowed as they hold the responsibility for observing and enforcing any requirements.

8.1 MAINTENANCE GRAVEL TENDER RESULTS

8.3 2022 BUDGET REVIEW

Treasurer Sean Brophy will presented updates to the 2022 budget that have been made since the January 17th meeting at which it was first presented.

8.3.1 Bluevale Community Committee Financial Support

Councillor Nelemans suggested using Safe Restart Funds to provide support to the Bluevale Community Committee in the amount of \$5,000.00 and the Belmore Arena Board in the amount of \$10,000.00. Discussion followed.

THAT the Council of the Municipality of Morris-Turnberry hereby approves the allocation of \$5000.00 of the municipality's COVID-19 funding as a grant to the Bluevale Community Committee.

8.3.2 Belmore Arena Board Financial Support

Motion 46-2022

Moved by Jim Nelemans Seconded by Sharen Zinn

THAT the Council of the Municipality of Morris-Turnberry hereby approves the allocation of \$10,000.00 of the municipality's COVID-19 funding as a grant to the Belmore Arena Board.

Carried.

8.3.3 North Huron Recreation Financial Support

Council discussed the individual components of the request for financial support and provided direction on each in turn.

Recreation Administration

There was a consensus of Council that the municipality should not be providing support for North Huron's administration costs.

Concessions

There was a consensus of Council that the municipality should not be providing support for the operation of concessions at recreation facilities.

Blyth Arena and Community Hall

Staff recommended considering support for the arena in the amount of \$35,238.00 but not supporting the hall. There was a consensus of Council to provide support for the Blyth Arena as recommended by staff.

North Huron Wescast Community Complex Fitness Centre

Staff recommended declining support for the fitness centre. There was a consensus of Council to decline support for the *North Huron Wescast Community Complex Fitness Centre* as recommended by staff.

Deputy Mayor Zinn requested clarification regarding how Morris-Turnberry's share was determined to be 22 percent. Mr. Brophy provided the answer as it was received from North Huron.

North Huron Wescast Community Complex Pool

Staff recommended considering support for the pool in the amount of \$34,102.00. Councillor Nelemans noted that he was on Council when it was constructed. He said there wasn't regional support for it at that time which is why Morris-Turnberry had never contributed to its operation. Deputy Mayor Zinn suggested that while Council may not have contributed in the past, it is used by residents and Council should consider supporting it. There was a consensus of Council to support the pool.

North Huron Wescast Community Complex Arena

Staff recommended considering support for the arena in the amount of \$35,238.00. There was a consensus of Council to provide support for the North Huron Wescast Community Complex Arena as recommended by staff.

Based on the preceding discussion Mr. Brophy recommended a rounded figure for support of \$115,000.00 and reviewed the impact to the tax rates and levies based on that figure.

Council discussed and was supportive of using the \$20,000.00 from the recreation reserve, as well as the \$20,000.00 allocated to the recreation reserve in the 2022 Budget to offset the total, and providing \$115,000.00 in financial support to North Huron in response to the grant request received for recreation facilities.
